

Press Release Young Architects in Africa competition results Paris, April 2nd, 2014

Further to the previous editions promoting the New Chinese Architecture in 2010 and Young Arab Architects in 2012, AS.Architecture-Studio organizes this year the Young Architects in Africa competition, in order to highlight African projects creativity, and help a rising generation of young architects achieve worldwide recognition.

The international jury gathered on Monday, March 31st 2014 to review the 194 projects submitted (from 26 African countries).

Three winners tied for the first place:
